


TWIN LINK FEBRUARY 2010

A “FLYING” VISIT TO THE COTES D’ARMOR.



It is 12.30 pm on Monday the 27th. July 2009, and from the runway at Newquay Airport Flight IOS772 takes to the skies en route to St. Brieuc in the Cotes d’Armor or the “*The bright side of Brittany*” as claimed by the locals. On board this flight operated by Skybus (the aviation branch of the Isles of Scilly Steamship Company;) are Sheila and Peter Willett, courtesy of TMTA, and a one pound winning raffle ticket.



This is our account of the visit we made to a part of Brittany we had longed to explore more deeply, our appetite having been wetted by several trips to Paimpol.

Our flight was in a de Havilland DH-6 Twin Otter with a crew of 2 (pilots) and just 6 other passengers. With plenty of all-round vision and flying at 9,000 feet in clear blue skies we were able to track our route across Cornwall, to Plymouth and Exeter and south over the water towards Guernsey and the Bay of Saint Brieuc. The approach to the airport was made all the more interesting by the fact that we were able to see the coastline that we hoped to visit in the following days.

On landing we were met by our son Mark, who had travelled overnight by car from his home in Surrey and would be providing our transport; in addition to having several other essentials on board for picnics etc.. Our accommodation for our weeks’ stay was at a B&B in Pordic, and the first things we noticed on entering the small town was that a} It is twinned with Hayle and b} on the Saturday evening the local Fire Brigade had a fundraising event serving MOULES and CHIPS etc. for 8Euros 50 per person this price to include cheese and apple pie; so there was one evening meal we did not have to look for.



Our weather throughout the week was good to excellent, (except for the Saturday when we had to wonder if we were back home,) so we made the most of the opportunities to take many of the well marked and maintained cliff walks, visit St Brieuc the Cathedral of which dates back to the 12th. Century, and the Town Hall which the municipal authorities have



occupied since 1805. Naturally we could not miss visiting Paimpol yet again, but this visit was a first in that it was Market Day; and one of the finest we have seen for many years.

Another trip on our “hit list” was to the Isle de Brehat, a 15 minute trip by boat off the mainland north of Paimpol and likened by many people to the Isles of Scilly. We can only say that we were bowled over by the scenery, abundance of flowers, and the general beauty of an island which is also a *must* for any ornithologist. Despite having been told and read about the effect of the low exchange rate between the pound and euro we found many restaurants serving extremely good meals at acceptable prices, and the firemen’s moules and chips evening, did not disappoint.

Upon arriving at the airport for our return flight we were told that there was a delay; -- in fact they had no idea where the plane was -- luckily our host who was with us, took us under her wing, agreed that she would phone to find any details later and we ended up at a local beach enjoying an early evening stroll and meal. Our flight left St. Brieuc at 8.30 (local time) flying through low cloud (which had been the earlier problem), and arrived at Newquay in heavy drizzle and mist.

The Mystery of the Missing Ginster Cup

The report on the Eddie Jones Memorial Boules Tournament in the autumn Twin Link referred to a missing cup and how it had been replaced with the new Penrose Trophy.

So what did this missing cup look like? Has anyone seen it in recent years? Who last had it? We need a ‘Hercule Poirot’ to solve the mystery.

First though we need to go back in time. Eddie Jones was a founder member of TMTA, and later, together with his wife Ernestine, went on to found the Twinning Committee for Cornwall, an umbrella organisation offering help and advice to local twinning groups.

Eddie was a stalwart supporter of twinning, attending almost every event and helping teach us how to play boules (petanque). When Eddie died in 2002 he left money to TMTA and at the following AGM it was decided to set up an annual boules tournament in his memory and use the legacy to buy trophies.

In May 2003 during the annual visit to Morlaix the three trophies currently used were purchased, and that autumn the inaugural boules tournament took place based on the lines of the county tournament, but with individuals competing instead of teams of three players.

The county tournament has among its trophies a Ginster Plate.....
