'Vive le Jumelage' - bonne chance pour le future.

I have just received an e-mail from Mavis telling me that she suffered a heart attack on the last day of a four week holiday in Malta, and spent Christmas day, and a few others, in a Maltese hospital. She is now home, but feeling rather frail, and hopes to have a new heart stent fitted soon.

This is the recipe that Jean Anderson made for the coffee morning recently, which was a big hit!

#### FIG AND APPLE CAKE

225g (8oz) unsalted butter, room temperature

225g (8oz) golden caster sugar

1 tsp vanilla extract

4 large eggs

225g (8oz) self-raising flour

4 tbs milk

2 tsp baking powder

250g (9oz) dried figs, chopped

400g (14oz) Cox's apples, peeled, cored and chopped

3 tsp cinnamon

25g (1oz) flaked almonds to decorate

Pre-heat oven to 180C ( 160C fan) mark 4. Line a 30.5x23cm (12x9in) roasting tin with greaseproof paper.

Using either a wooden spoon or an electric hand whisk, beat together the butter, sugar and vanilla extract until pale and fluffy. Add the eggs, little by little, adding 1tbsp flour each time if the mixture looks as if it is curdling. Stir in the milk.

Sift together remaining flour and the baking powder, then fold into the mixture using a metal spoon- it should have a dropping consistency and fall easily off a spoon. If it's too thick, stir in an extra 1tbsp milk.

Toss the figs, apples and cinnamon together in a bowl, then fold into the mixture.

Spoon into the lined tin, level the surface and sprinkle almonds on top. Bake for 35-40 minutes or until golden and a skewer inserted into the middle comes out clean. If the cake browns too quickly, cover the top with foil to protect it

Variations:

Lemon and Ginger: Beat 200g (7oz) grated stem ginger together with the butter, sugar and vanilla extract in Step 2. Complete the recipe, folding in the zest and juice of 2 medium lemons and 2tbsp poppy seeds.

Coconut and Banana: Make the recipe to the end of Step 3, omitting the milk. Fold in 50g (2oz) desiccated coconut, 3 mashed bananas and 150g (5oz) chopped walnuts. Bake for 30 min rather than 35-40.
